Two arrested after brutal home invasion

KANNAPOLIS — Two men are in custody after Kannapolis Police said two gunmen broke into a man's home Friday night and assaulted him.

According to Kannapolis Police, the victim was asleep when two men dressed in black and wearing ski masks broke into his home in the 900 block of Airline Drive and began striking him.

The man was “severely beaten with numerous lacerations to his head,” the report said.

Police have not released the victim's name.

Officers said the two robbers fled on foot. A cell phone was the only thing reported taken from the home.

Police stopped a 2004 Buick, driving without headlights, on Bishop Lane near Concord Lake Road.

An officer stopped the Buick and found evidence inside “connecting the two occupants to the crime,” the report said.

Juan Gonzales Amaya, 22, of Rogers Lake Road, and **Jose Daniel Soto**, 23, of Beaumont Avenue, were arrested.

They were **each charged with felony robbery with a dangerous weapon, felony assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill and felony first-degree burglary.**

Gonzales and Soto remained in Cabarrus County jail today, each under \$300,000 bonds.

Murder Suspect Arrested In Ayden

Greenville Police tell WITN that the man accused of stabbing a Beaufort County woman to death in Greenville on Tuesday night is now in custody.

The arrest was made by the US Marshall Task Force, the Greenville Police Department, the FBI, and the Pitt County Sheriff's Office.

Greenville Police say 24 year old **Max Albert Dorat Tejada** was arrested at a residence on Ayden Golf Club Road around 3 p.m. **He is a native of El Salvadore.**

The victim, Elizabeth Hope Cutler of Washington, died this morning at Vidant Medical Center, after being stabbed multiple times at Sedge-Field Apartments on Concord Drive.

Relatives say she went by her middle name of Hope and police now confirm her age as 32.

Witnesses told police they saw a man and a woman in a dispute and as the woman began to use a cell phone, the man threw it on the pavement and then stabbed her several times.

The attacker then ran toward the railroad tracks behind the apartment.

Maxton man charged in murder

MAXTON — A Maxton man has been arrested and charged with the murder of a 31-year-old man who was reported missing on Thursday, according to the Robeson County Sheriff's Office.

Adrian Hernandez, 30, of 26 Isiah Road, is **charged with first-degree murder** in the death of Vinson Junior Oxendine, of 199 Lakewood Drive, Maxton. Deputies found Hernandez hiding in a heating unit compartment of a mobile home in Lumber Bridge, according to sheriff's Maj. Howard Branch. He is being held in the Robeson County jail under no bond.

Oxendine's body was found during a search of woods near a field on Oxendine School Road. The body has been taken to Chapel Hill for an autopsy by the state Medical Examiners Office.

Emily Goodman, of 409 Harper's Ferry Road in Maxton, reported Oxendine missing on Thursday morning. She said Oxendine left at about 9:30 p.m. on Wednesday to meet someone about some money and never returned, according to Branch. Oxendine's black four-door sedan was found on the side of Arthur Road at about 11:30 a.m. on Thursday.

Branch said Hernandez was linked to the murder through "numerous interviews" and "extensive legwork" by sheriff's deputies. U.S. marshals and State Bureau of Investigation agents helped with the investigation.

Man charged in high-profile fatality now a fugitive

Local and federal authorities are searching for a man who jumped bail after being charged with three felonies stemming from a fatal accident late last year in Kill Devil Hills.

A malfunctioning traffic signal was flashing when the accident took place Oct. 5, touching off an intense debate over responsibility for controlling the intersection and eventually leading to lower speed limits.

Luis Alberto Rodriguez, 44, of Colington **failed to appear in court and is now a fugitive**, District Attorney Frank Parrish said last week. Federal authorities, he said, have been called in "to cast a wide net and try to locate him."

Rodriguez has been charged with felony death by vehicle while engaged in the offense of impaired driving, two counts of felonious serious injury by vehicle and driving while impaired.

Rodriguez was hospitalized in Norfolk after the accident. He later posted secured bond that had been reduced to \$50,000, according to court records.

Kill Devil Hills police Capt. Gene Johnson said that **Rodriguez had been in the country on a temporary visa that has expired**. He said the FBI is also working on the case.

Joseph Storie, 51, of Lenoir died from injuries in the wreck. He was a passenger in a pickup truck that rolled over in the accident. The driver of the truck, 43-year-old Paul Thomas, sustained minor injuries and was treated at The Outer Banks Hospital.

Storie's wife, 37-year-old Alicia, and sister, 45-year-old Christina, were in the back seat of the pickup. They were flown to Sentara Norfolk General Hospital.

Storie was visiting the Outer Banks with his family.

An investigation determined that Rodriguez was traveling east on Colington Road and failed to stop for a flashing red light, police said. Rodriguez drove his Chevrolet Lumina into the intersection and was struck by the Chevrolet pickup, which was traveling south.

The traffic signal had malfunctioned about two hours before the crash. Traffic on U.S. 158 had a flashing yellow signal, giving vehicles the right of way, while traffic on Colington Road and Ocean Bay Boulevard had a flashing red light.

The North Carolina Department of Transportation was notified of the malfunctioning light but had not arrived to make repairs before the crash. Some questioned why police were not directing traffic.

The intersection was closed for three and a half hours until the scene was cleared.

The victim's death was due to a laceration to the neck by a cutting instrument and a stab wound to the upper left chest area.

The Sheriff's department has received significant assistance from Hickory Police Dept., Greensboro Police Dept. and Immigrations Custom Enforcement (ICE).

Sheriff Barnes would also like to thank the Latino community for their assistance in solving this case. The citizens have been forth coming and have been very cooperative.

KINSTON, N.C. – Kinston police say a woman they found unconscious was arrested and charged for trying to run over a man with a car on Friday.

Police say the victim, 56-year-old Jose Rodolfo Vasquez-Castro was called to the Fairfield Park area by Jessica Lynn Trevena early Friday morning. Vasquez-Castro told officials he knew Trevena. When he got there she tried to take the keys from his car. Two other men then assaulted him and took his cell phone, pocket knife and car. Vasquez-Castro says Trevena then tried to run him over with the car.

Later that afternoon, officers when to a home on 1826 Dupree Street where they believed Trevena was. Officers arrived to find her unconscious. She was taken to Lenoir Memorial Hospital.

Trevena was arrested Monday at the hospital. She was charged with robbery with a dangerous weapon and assault with a deadly weapon. She was jailed under a \$62,000 bond.

North Carolina Man Arrested in Texas with Half Ton of Pot

JASPER COUNTY, TX (KTRE) - Two out-of-state men arrested after a Jasper County trooper reported finding more than 1,000 pounds of marijuana in a box trailer are being held in the jail on \$500,000 bonds and an immigration hold.

A justice of the peace set the bonds Wednesday morning.

Enar David Zuniga, 45, of Clinton, NC, and Henry Hernandez, 31, of Pleasantville, NJ, were arrested Monday morning after a state trooper said he found **1,000 pounds of marijuana** in the back of a truck along US 190, west of Jasper.

The pair is charged with first-degree delivery of marijuana.

I.C.E. officials have placed a hold on the pair, alleging they are illegal immigrants.

Man gets \$1 million bond; accused of assaulting 7-year-old girl

A man was in the Davidson County Detention Center under a \$1 million bond Monday morning after the Lexington Police Department alleges he sexually assaulted a 7-year-old girl.

Franklin Vasquez, 37, of 611 Ford St., has been **charged with felony first-degree sex offense with a child**. He has a court date of July 24.

According to the Lexington Police Department, the mother of the girl visited Wake Forest Baptist Health — Lexington Medical Center and alleged that her daughter had been sexually assaulted. The mother told police that while holding a get-together June 2 with a few friends at her home, a friend sexually assaulted her daughter. The girl was taken to Lexington Medical Center on June 4, where she was treated and released.

Vasquez, according to court documents, is considered a flight risk and was deported two years ago. U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement were on their way Monday morning to Lexington to detain him, a spokeswoman with the Davidson County Clerk of Court's Office said.

Charlotte man killed in motorcycle accident

CONCORD — A Charlotte man was killed Saturday night when his motorcycle struck a car that pulled into his pathway at the intersection of U.S. 29 and Central Drive.

Ray Levon Horsley, 58, of Hollyburgh Terrace died after being transported to Carolinas Medical Center Northeast.

According to a press release, Horsley was driving south on U.S. 29 **when a 2000 Mitsubishi Eclipse driven by Victor Hugo Salinas traveling north made a left turn into the path of the motorcycle** about 9:25 p.m. Saturday.

There were four passengers in the car with Salinas at the time of the accident. No one them were seriously injured.

Salinas, 28, of Barron Ridge in Kannapolis has been charged with misdemeanor **death by motor vehicle, driving while license revoked and a child restraint violation**.

He is in jail on a \$100,000 bond.

GREENVILLE- Drug officers announced a drug bust Friday that seized 122 pounds of marijuana after a five-month investigation into drug trafficking.

Officers from the Greenville Regional Drug Task Force and the Pitt County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit arrested **Filiberto Cobarrubias-Herrera**, 38, of Mebane and **Angel Aguirre Luna**, 47, of Burlington about 7:30 a.m. Friday at the intersection of Memorial Drive and Stantonsburg Road.

The Goldsboro Police Department and Lenoir County Sheriff's Office also assisted in the investigation, according to a news release issued by the Greenville Police Department.

Cobarrubias-Herrera was charged with one count of conspiring to traffic marijuana. Luna was charged with three counts of trafficking marijuana and one count of conspiring to traffic marijuana.

The two were taken to the Pitt County Detention Center. Both placed under a \$2 million secured bond.

Rodriguez is being held in the Cherokee County Detention Center under a \$40,000 bond.

Carlos Valesquez, who shares the apartment, was being treated at an area hospital for a stab wound that was not thought to life-threatening, Cary police said.

Officers said they found the two in the parking lot at the apartments after getting a call about a fight at 2:41 a.m. They said they did not know what the subject of the fight was.

Bond for Martinez was set at \$10,000, but he also was held on a request known as a detainer while federal Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) authorities checked his immigration status. Defendants being held on ICE detainers are not released for a time regardless of their bond

5 suspects arrested 2002 Raleigh homicide

RALEIGH -- Police have all but completed their investigation of a man's 2002 killing after a card game and a fight, returning the second of three murder suspects to the city on Friday and awaiting the extradition of the third from Georgia.

It has been eight and a half years since they made their first arrest in the February 2002 shooting death of Martin Herrera Sotelo, 27, whose body was found in a trash bin outside an apartment complex near N.C. State University after a resident tipped off a police officer who was there on an unrelated call almost 20 hours after the slaying.

Friday, police returned **Noel Monterrubio Garcia**, 42, to Raleigh from Forsyth County, Ga., where sheriff's deputies, working with Raleigh detectives, found him. He was ordered held in the Wake County Jail without bail.

Still in Forsyth County is **Tomas Serrano Garcia**, 41, who had been arrested there on other charges, police said. They are awaiting an extradition order to bring him back to Raleigh.

Police found Sotelo's body in the dumpster and blood in Apartment 15 at 1527 Crest Road. That was where, police said, a card game had led to a fight and then to a shooting.

At the time of the killing, police arrested **Epimenio Gomez Perez**, who was 23 at the time, and **Vbaldo Gomez Perez**, who was 21 then, and charged them with being accessories after the fact of murder. The brothers lived in the apartment, police said, and had helped dispose of Sotelo's body.

At the time, police issued warrants for the two Garcias arrested this year and **Orlando Monterrubio Garcia**, now 37, but could not find them. Police said at the time that the trio, who are related, "just packed up their stuff and left."

In 2003, however, police got word that Orlando Garcia was at a Buffalo Road trailer park and found him there and arrested him.

DWI Suspect Charged After Stopping At Green Light

Man arrested in Wilmington knife attack

A Sunday morning knife attack in Wilmington left a victim with severe stab wounds to his stomach and hands, police said.

Officers arrested **Angel Adony Gomez-Acevedo**, 27, on a **charge of assault with a deadly weapon with intent to kill** in Sunday's attack, which occurred on Bailey Buck Road. Police responding to the scene arrested Acevedo after setting up a perimeter and using a dog to track his scent.

Lucy Crockett, a spokeswoman for the Wilmington Police Department, said Acevedo is accused of provoking a dispute with the victim, David Villegas, 46, over a woman about 12:30 a.m. Sunday. Witnesses told police Acevedo initially stabbed Villegas with a small utility knife but later ran into his house at 6106 Bailey Buck Road to fetch a large kitchen knife. A third man tried to intervene, but Acevedo cut the man's hand, Crockett said.

After the attack, the suspect ran into the woods. Police tracked him to an area near Chilcot Lane, where they arrested him, Crockett said.

The two injured men were transported to a hospital for treatment. Acevedo was confined in the New Hanover County under a \$200,000 bond.

Common Law Robbery Suspect Caught

Man Caught With \$1.2M In Cocaine Sentenced

A Duplin County man caught with \$1.2 million in cocaine in February has been convicted of trafficking cocaine. **Rosebert Espondola**, 43, of Faison was arrested by the Johnston County Sheriff's Office after a tip led them to a room at the Days Inn in Kenly. Inside, they found **8 kilos of cocaine worth \$800,000**.

Information gathered at the scene led officers to an address on Spring Branch Lane, **Angier in western Johnston County where an additional 4 kilos of cocaine, valued at \$400,000 was seized.**

Espondola was sentenced to serve between 35 and 42 months in the NC Department of Corrections, according to Assistant District Attorney Greg Butler.

The 12 kilos of cocaine seized in February was one of the largest cocaine busts in Johnston County history.

4 Arrested For Drinking And Driving

Smithfield Police made four weekend alcohol related driving arrests. Officers say it is part of their ongoing effort to remove impaired drivers from the streets of Smithfield.

Police said Pacheco was pulled over in a 2009 Ford Focus for speeding. He registered 0.06, but because he was under age 21 and not allowed to consume any alcohol and operate a vehicle police said, he was **charged with driving after consuming alcohol and also issued a speeding citation.** Pacheco was given a \$1,500 bond and ordered to appear in district court on July 5.

Pascual Ayala, 26, (right) of South Brightleaf Boulevard, Smithfield was stopped by officers not very far from his home at 2:57am Saturday. Police said Ayala was driving a 1993 Chevy Blazer while **under the influence of alcohol and without a driver’s license.** Ayala registered 0.17 on the Breathalyzer, double the legal limit of 0.08, according to Lt. Omero Montez Cruz, 27, (left) of 301 Mobile Home Park, Smithfield was arrested at 2:49am Saturday in the 2300 block of South Brightleaf Boulevard after police stopped his SUV. Cruz registered 0.21 on the Breathalyzer, Lt. Powell said. Cruz was charged with **driving while impaired and driving on a revoked license.**

Police seized a SUV driven by **Angelino Heredia Diaz**, 24, (right) of Maxton-Bass Road, Newton Grove during a traffic stop on South Brightleaf Boulevard at 10:25pm Saturday, according to Smithfield Police. **Diaz license were revoked from a prior DWI conviction and he was wanted for failing to appear in court in January on another DWI charge. During Saturday’s arrest, police allege Diaz was also impaired.**

Lt. Keith Powell said Diaz refused to submit to a Breathalyzer exam. He was released on a \$2,500 bond pending a July 16 trial date. **Because of his prior DWI conviction and Diaz allegedly driving under the influence again, Lt. Powell said officers impounded his 2000 Chevy Blazer pending the outcome of the case in court.**

5 Charged In Operation Summer Heat

Leader of drug trafficking organization sentenced

RALEIGH, N.C. – The leader of a North Carolina drug trafficking organization was sentenced to more than 21 years in prison Tuesday, following an investigation by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI).

Jose Manuel Hernandez-Iturralde, 28, was sentenced by United States District Judge Malcolm J. Howard for his role in a **drug trafficking organization that operated in North Carolina from 2000 through 2010**.

"Our agents systematically identified the members of this criminal organization and successfully targeted them for arrest and prosecution," said Brock D. Nicholson, special agent in charge of HSI Atlanta. "HSI remains committed to working with our local partners, in this case the Lee County Sheriff's Department, to dismantle the criminal organizations smuggling narcotics and committing associated crimes throughout North Carolina and the rest of the United States." Nicholson oversees HSI activities in Georgia and the Carolinas.

On Feb. 16, 2011, a federal grand jury returned a criminal indictment that charged Hernandez with participating in a drug trafficking conspiracy, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846. On December 5, 2011, Hernandez pleaded guilty to that offense.

The investigation revealed that since 2000, Hernandez and other co-conspirators maintained several residences in Wake, Randolph and Guilford counties to store, process and distribute cocaine, as well as to count, package and stash the drug proceeds from the cocaine distribution. Since the beginning of the HSI investigation in 2009, approximately 40 members of this drug trafficking organization have been prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office in Raleigh and sentenced accordingly.

All told, **Hernandez and his drug trafficking organization were responsible for importing and distributing approximately 6,000 kilograms of cocaine in North Carolina**.

Police Seize 122 Pounds Of Pot In Greenville

Durham attorney sentenced for immigration fraud

A Durham attorney was sentenced to probation and can no longer practice law in North Carolina after pleading guilty to **knowingly submitting a fraudulent Application for Naturalization**.

Alexander L. Lapinski's three years of probation will include eight months of monitored home detention and comes with a \$1,600 fine. He can never practice in immigrations courts again, and he voluntarily surrendered his North Carolina law license following his guilty plea, according to a Department of Justice news release.

Between 2009 and January 2010, Lapinski aided and abetted Oleksiy Solomonkoby making false statements on his application. He certified that Solomonko's name was Roman Kylymnyk. The investigation was conducted by the U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, Homeland Security Investigations.

30 indicted in fake ID scheme

Federal authorities have indicted 30 people, including 16 local residents, in an alleged scheme to get fake driver's licenses from New Mexico.

The people were living in the United States illegally and traveled from South Carolina and neighboring states to apply for New Mexico driver's licenses, federal prosecutors said. New Mexico, unlike South Carolina, does not require proof of U.S. citizenship for a driver's license, according to the indictments.

Those charged are: 54-year-old Alma Rosa Ortiz-Calzada, 29-year-old Jesus Ortiz, 29-year-old Concepcion Prieto-Juarez, 20-year-old Alejandra Torricos-Cuellar, 31-year-old Juan Pablo Valladares-Martinez, 32-year-old Darco Jordan-Tapia, 23-year-old Marisol Pantoja-Loredo and 41-year-old Gustavo Torricos-Vargas of Charleston; 32-year-old Jorge Alvarez-Chavez, 22-year-old Luis Alvarez-Robles and 42-year-old Gabriel Sotelo of North Charleston; 23-year-old Marcos Medina-Zavaleta of Hanahan; 36-year-old Salvador Hernandez-Santillan of Summerville; 32-year-old Fabian Sanchez-Hernandez and 35-year-old Horacio Jasso-Hernandez of Mount Pleasant; and 30-year-old Jose Alvarez-Robles of Ladson, SC.

Authorities also indicted five New Mexico residents, two Tennessee residents, one Georgia resident, three Virginia residents and one **North Carolina resident**. Two other people named in the indictment had unknown addresses.

Authorities said the people indicted used false proof of New Mexico residency, such as utility bills, and gave those documents to the New Mexico Motor Vehicle Department to apply for driver's licenses. They came back to South Carolina, while people living in New Mexico mailed the licenses to them, prosecutors said.

Officials with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Immigration and Customs Enforcement and the New Mexico Taxation and Revenue Department investigated the case.

The indictments allege conspiracy to transfer false identification documents and producing and transferring false identification documents, both of which carry a maximum prison sentence of 15 years. The indictments also allege conspiracy to transport illegal aliens and transporting those people, each of which carry a maximum prison sentence of 10 years.

50 Charged with Selling Identities of Puerto Rican US Citizens

Conspirators in 15 states and Puerto Rico trafficked the identities of Puerto Rican U.S. citizens, corresponding Social Security cards, Puerto Rico birth certificates and other identification documents to undocumented aliens and others residing in the United States.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Fifty individuals were charged in an indictment unsealed in Puerto Rico with conspiracy to commit identification fraud in connection with their alleged roles in a scheme to traffic the identities of Puerto Rican U.S. citizens and corresponding identity documents. The charges are the result of an extensive investigation led by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), in partnership with other federal, state and local law enforcement agencies.

The charges were announced by ICE Director John Morton; Assistant Attorney General Lanny A. Breuer of the Justice Department's Criminal Division; U.S. Attorney Rosa E. Rodríguez-Vélez for the District of Puerto Rico; Chief Postal Inspector Guy Cottrell of the U.S. Postal Inspection Service (USPIS); Scott P. Bultrowicz, Director of the U.S. State Department's Diplomatic Security Service (DSS); and Internal Revenue Service-Criminal Investigation (IRS-CI) Acting Chief Rick Raven.

Defendants were arrested today in multiple districts throughout the United States and Puerto Rico and will make initial appearances in federal court in the districts in which they were arrested. In addition, law enforcement agents executed searches as part of an ongoing investigation.

"Today's arrests are a reflection of ICE Homeland Security Investigations unrelenting determination to identify and dismantle national smuggling rings engaged in document and identity fraud," said ICE Director Morton. "The conspiracy alleged to be perpetrated by those charged undermines the integrity of our national immigration system. We will continue working with our federal partners to protect our homeland from criminals who have no regard for our nation's safety and security."

"The indictment unsealed today alleges that from April 2009 to December 2011, the defendants operated an extensive black market, identity fraud ring," said Assistant Attorney General Breuer. "The alleged conspiracy stretched across the United States and Puerto Rico, using suppliers, identity brokers and mail and money runners to fill and deliver orders for the personal identifying information and government-issued identity documents of Puerto Rican U.S. citizens. Those willing to buy and sell personal identifying information and documents should take notice of today's actions. The department and our law enforcement partners will not allow this kind of illegal activity to continue."

According to the indictment, from at least April 2009 to December 2011, conspirators in 15 states and Puerto Rico, a U.S. territory, trafficked the identities of Puerto Rican U.S. citizens, corresponding Social Security cards, Puerto Rico birth certificates and other identification documents to undocumented aliens and others residing in the United States.

The indictment alleges that conspirators located in the Savarona area of Caguas, Puerto Rico (Savarona suppliers) obtained the Puerto Rican identities and corresponding identity documents. Conspirators in various locations throughout the United States (identity brokers) solicited customers. The identity brokers allegedly sold Social Security cards and corresponding Puerto Rico birth certificates for prices ranging from \$700 to \$2,500 per set. The indictment alleges that identity brokers ordered the identity documents from Savarona suppliers, on behalf of the customers, by making coded telephone calls, including using terms such as "shirts," "uniforms" or "clothes," to refer to identity documents. Specifically, the brokers asked for "skirts" for female customers and "pants" for male customers in various "sizes," which referred to the ages of the identities sought by the customers.

According to the indictment, the Savarona suppliers generally requested that customers' initial payments be sent by the identity brokers through a money transfer service to persons whose names were provided by the Savarona suppliers. Savarona suppliers allegedly retrieved the payments from the money transfer service and then sent the identity documents to the brokers using express, priority or regular U.S. mail. The indictment alleges that various conspirators sent or received money and mail parcels. The conspirators frequently

confirmed sender names and addresses, money transfer control numbers and trafficked identities via text messaging.

According to the indictment, once the identity brokers received the identity documents, they delivered the documents to the customers and obtained second payments. The brokers generally kept the second payments for themselves as profit. Some identity brokers allegedly assumed a Puerto Rican identity themselves, and used that identity in connection with the trafficking operation.

As alleged in the indictment, the customers generally obtained the identity documents to assume the identity of Puerto Rican U.S. citizens and to obtain additional identification documents, such as legitimate state driver's licenses. Some customers allegedly obtained the documents to commit financial fraud and attempted to obtain a U.S. passport.

"From Main Street to Wall Street, identity fraud exacts a devastating toll on American consumers and businesses. U.S. Postal Inspectors will continue to aggressively investigate criminals who use the mail to defraud postal customers," said Chief Postal Inspector Cottrell.

"The Diplomatic Security Service is firmly committed to working with our law enforcement partners to investigate and bring to justice those who commit document trafficking and identity fraud," said Director Bultrowicz of the U.S. State Department's Diplomatic Security Service. "Fraudulently-obtained documents are frequently used to apply for U.S. passports and visas, two of the most coveted travel documents in the world."

"IRS Criminal Investigation has made investigating identity theft a top priority," said Acting Chief Raven of the IRS-CI. "We are committed to working with our law enforcement partners to unravel the money trail of criminal enterprises that defraud government and prey on unwitting victims."

The indictment alleges that various identity brokers were operating in Rockford, Ill.; Indianapolis; DeKalb, Ill.; Columbus and Seymour, Ind.; Aurora, Ill.; Hartford, Conn.; Clewiston, Fla.; Lilburn and Norcross, Ga.; Salisbury, Md.; Columbus, Ohio; Fairfield, Ohio; Dorchester, Mass.; Lawrence, Mass.; Salem, Mass.; Worcester, Mass.; Grand Rapids, Mich.; Nebraska City, Neb.; Elizabeth, N.J.; **Burlington, N.C.; Hickory, N.C.**; Hazelton, Pa.; Philadelphia; Houston; and Abingdon, Va.

If convicted, each defendant faces a maximum sentence of 15 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine, as well as forfeiture.

The charges announced today are the result of Operation Island Express, an ongoing, nationally-coordinated investigation led by the ICE HSI Chicago office, in partnership with USPIS, DSS and IRS-CI offices in Chicago. The investigation was also coordinated with the ICE HSI San Juan office. The Illinois Secretary of State Police; Elgin, Ill., Police Department; Seymour, Ind., Police Department; and Indiana State Police provided substantial assistance. The ICE HSI Assistant Attaché office in the Dominican Republic, National Drug Intelligence Center - Document and Media Exploitation Branch and International Organized Crime Intelligence and Operations Center (IOC-2) provided invaluable assistance as well as various ICE, USPIS, DSS and IRS CI offices around the country.

The case is being prosecuted by the Criminal Division's Human Rights and Special Prosecutions Section, with the assistance of the Criminal Division's Asset Forfeiture and Money Laundering Section, and the support of the U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Puerto Rico. The U.S. Attorneys' Offices in the Northern District of Illinois, Southern District of Indiana and District of Connecticut provided substantial assistance. The U.S. Attorneys' Offices in the Middle District of Florida, Southern District of Florida, Northern District of Georgia, Western District of Kentucky, District of Maryland, District of Massachusetts, Western District of Michigan, District of Nebraska, District of New Jersey, **Western District of North Carolina**, Southern District of Ohio, Eastern District of Pennsylvania, Middle District of Pennsylvania, Southern District of Texas, Eastern District

of Virginia, Southern District of Illinois, Western District of Texas, Middle District of Louisiana and Western District of Virginia also provided invaluable support.

New charges filed against Newton DMV examiner

NEWTON, N.C.- Fifteen more felony charges been filed in the case of the Department of Motor Vehicles examiner who has been charged with giving away driver's licenses illegally.

Cathy Warlick Rudisill, 62, of Vale, was originally charged with 13 counts of wrongful issuance of a driver's license on May 9. Now she's facing 28 counts of the crime.

It's not clear why Rudisill may have issued licenses illegally, if she was paid to do it or if she was **giving licenses to illegal immigrants**.

Members of the media went to Rudisill to ask for her side of the story Tuesday afternoon. When she spotted them, she jumped off her orange lawn mower and sprinted into the house. Asked if she would answer any questions, she shouted, "No sir, no sir," as she ran away.

Law enforcement's side of the story is straight forward.

Rudisill worked in the Newton office of the DMV as a senior examiner. She'd worked there for almost two years when she was arrested. Her salary was \$34,784.

Each of the 28 warrants described what she did as, "Knowing it is false, enters false information concerning a driver's license or a special identification card in the records of the division."

The problems came to light April 25 when someone tipped off Rudisill's boss. The informant told him it was possible to get a North Carolina Driver's License in Newton without presenting proper documentation or taking a written test, according to court records.

Her boss looked into the allegation and found that Rudisill had issued 54 questionable licenses from Jan. 1 through May 4 of this year.

The average processing time on a license is about 30 minutes. Rudisill was allegedly getting it done in less than five minutes. She is also accused of allowing the license recipients to take the tests manually rather than on the computer system as required by the state – thereby eliminating the electronic record of the test.

“The only time manual testing is allowed is when the computer system is inoperable and the Driver’s License Examiner has received permission from Raleigh NCDMV headquarters to proceed with the manual test,” according to court records.

Rudisill never got permission to give manual tests.

Court records state that she gave out the majority of the improper licenses in the latter part of the week.

The 21 licenses that Rudisill allegedly gave out improperly on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays total 75 percent of the total.

There is no clear pattern that would establish whether more of the licenses were given out in the early or late parts of the month.

Rudisill got out of jail on an unsecured bond. Her next court appearance is scheduled for June 28.

Two shot, one dead after bar fight early Tuesday morning

CHARLOTTE, NC- Two people were shot, one dead after a fight inside of an east Charlotte bar early Tuesday morning.

Charlotte-Mecklenburg police officers scrambled to 5800 block of Albemarle Road after shots rang out at a popular bar.

Two people, according to Medic were hit with gunfire.

The CMPD said around 2am, a fight between two patrons happened **at the El Paisano restaurant and bar.**

An employee, believed to be the bouncer, tried to clear the place. When he and the two men involved in the scuffle made it outside, someone pulled a gun and opened fire. The victim in the shooting was identified by police as Richard Snyder, 50. A woman also was shot in the melee but not seriously hurt.

The employee died in the parking lot. According to Medics, he was hit five or six times.

Another woman, who witnesses said was pregnant, was also struck. Officers believe she was hit either with a ricochet or by a bullet fragment.

"The patient was shot in the trunk of her body." said Medic operations supervisor Kenny Phillips.

She was taken to the hospital, but officials believe she'll recover.

The glass door was also shattered, giving investigators an idea how many times the gunman pulled the trigger.

A gun was spotted on the scene, but officers wouldn't make the connection between the weapon and the crime at this point.

The men involved fled the area.

"Two Hispanic males that were in the altercation, they were last seen in a green, possibly a Chevy pickup truck." said police Captain Chick Henson.

"They were headed outbound on Albemarle Road."

On Tuesday night, police announced they'd identified **Habacu Rodriguez Lopez**, 37, as a suspect in the shooting. He was **arrested and charged with murder and assault with a deadly weapon.**

Police also said they found the Chevrolet truck seen fleeing the scene.

Man Kidnapped Niece in Charlotte who Escaped in Georgia; Suspect Captured in SC

CMPD Independence Division Officers responded to a kidnapping call and met with the mother of one of the victims, Guillermina Leon. Ms. Leon stated that she left for work around 6:40am and when she returned home, she found her sister, Clementina Leon, tied up with duct tape. Guillermina Leon stated that her 12-year old daughter was missing from the apartment. Clementina Leon stated she was at home sleeping when her brother, **Cristino Leon**, came into her room and was trying to tie her up with duct tape. She attempted to fight him, but he successfully tied her up with the duct tape. Clementina Leon said that Cristino Leon threatened to take her, but he didn't. Clementina Leon remained tied up for a couple of hours but was eventually able to break free from the duct tape. While she was tied up, Cristino Leon left the apartment with her niece.

During the course of the investigation, detectives determined that Cristino Leon was in Jefferson, Georgia. The Jefferson Police Department were contacted and they advised that they were currently out with a female who stated she had been kidnapped. CMPD Communications confirmed that the female victim was the 12-year old daughter of Guillermina Leon, niece of both Clementina Leon (adult victim) and Cristino Leon (suspect).

The 12-year old victim was able to escape when Cristino Leon stopped to eat at Exit 137 off I-85 in Jefferson, Georgia. She jumped out the car and ran to a woman for help. That woman called 911 and alerted authorities. Missing Persons detectives and personnel with Youth and Family Services coordinated the return of the 12-year old victim with authorities in Georgia.

Two Warrants for Kidnapping were issued for the arrest of Cristino Leon. Troopers with the South Carolina Highway Patrol took Mr. Leon into custody tonight at about 7:00 p.m., during a traffic stop conducted in Spartanburg County. The CMPD wishes to thank our fellow Law Enforcement Agencies in Georgia and South Carolina for their assistance throughout this investigation.

In small-town USA, business as usual for Mexican cartels

Wilmington, North Carolina (CNN) -- Less than a mile off a county road in Ivanhoe near the Black River, federal drug agents and local authorities found exactly what their informant had promised.

"We saw what looked like, as far as you could see, marijuana plants," said Drug Enforcement Administration agent Michael Franklin.

There were about 2,400 in all, surrounded by a makeshift camp where the growers had illegally squatted on private property, setting up a generator and pump to tap the river for irrigation. The camp, which had been recently inhabited, contained a tarp shelter, canned fuel, drinking water, toiletries and old clothing, some of it camouflage.

Authorities staked out the "grow" for two days waiting for the marijuana farmers to return. They didn't. It was just as well, Franklin said.

"The people we were really focusing on were not the guys tending the field. The guys bankrolling the field were the target," he said.

Those guys, according to the DEA's source, were members of La Familia Michoacana, a Mexican drug cartel that the Justice Department says focuses primarily on moving heroin, cocaine, marijuana and methamphetamine into the southeastern and southwestern United States.

Because the investigation into the June 2009 seizure is still ongoing, the DEA would not divulge further details. But Franklin said the case is one in a growing list of cartel-linked busts he is seeing in largely rural southeastern North Carolina. The area's Latino population has grown considerably in the past 20 years, and authorities say cartel operatives use Latino communities as cover.

"While the majority of (Latino residents in the area) are hardworking people like anyone else, it's an opportunity for the cartels to have their foot soldiers do their thing, too," Franklin said. Based in Wilmington, he is resident agent in charge of 14 counties.

News of cartel machinations are common in cities near the border, such as Phoenix, and the far-flung drug hubs of New York, Chicago or Atlanta, but smaller towns bring business, too. In unsuspecting suburbs and rural areas, police are increasingly finding drugs, guns and money they can trace back to Mexican drug organizations. On the border: Guns, drugs -- and a betrayal of trust

The numbers could rise in coming years. The Justice Department's National Drug Intelligence Center estimates Mexican cartels control distribution of most of the methamphetamine, heroin and marijuana coming into the country, and they're increasingly producing the drugs themselves.

In 2009 and 2010, the center reported, cartels operated in 1,286 U.S. cities, more than five times the number reported in 2008. The center named only 50 cities in 2006.

Target communities often have an existing Hispanic population and a nearby interstate for ferrying drugs and money to and fro, said author Charles Bowden, whose books on the Mexican drug war include "Murder City: Ciudad Juarez and the Global Economy's New Killing Fields."

"I'm not saying Mexicans come here to do crime, but Mexicans who move drugs choose to do it through areas where there are already Mexicans," he said.

Evidence of the cartels' presence in small-town America isn't hard to find. Take the 66 kilos of cocaine found in a warehouse in North Kingstown, Rhode Island, in February 2011. Or the Wyoming, Michigan, man denied bail on drug charges last year because he had alleged cartel connections. Or consider that a surge of Mexican black tar heroin into Ohio pushed the price per kilogram down from \$50,000 in 2008 to \$33,000 in 2009.

Ties that bind

It isn't always so clear cut, Franklin said. The DEA has several cases where cartel activity is suspected, but agents are unable to draw definitive links.

In fact, so much of the Wilmington bureau's caseload involves suspected cartel activity that Franklin three years ago set up a tip line, which it now promotes on large Spanish-language radio stations across the state.

The 30-second spot urges listeners to call 1-855-663-7642 if they know of any illicit activity involving drugs or money, assures them calls are confidential and offers rewards for useful information.

Spanish-speaking operators answer calls to the tip line, vet the information and quickly inform the DEA when a tip seems viable. Callers range from good citizens sick of dealers in their neighborhoods to suspicious relatives to underpaid couriers looking to turn informant.

"Sometimes it's just a report that some dude is talking s**t at parties," Franklin said.

There are also those who are terrified to return home to face cartel justice, where a swift decapitation could be a merciful resolution. Franklin calls it "ajuste de cuentas," a term he learned while stationed in Mazatlan, Mexico. Meaning "reckoning" or "balancing the books," it's an order to take out a subordinate who loses money or drugs, and it's usually not pretty.

"If they lose a load of dope, how could they pay back \$3 million in cocaine when their fee was only \$5,000 to move it? That guy comes to our side and we seize that much cocaine, he's going to make a lot more money with us," Franklin said.

DEA agents recently allowed CNN to accompany them on a seizure generated by the tip line.

It was just after 8 on a February night, and a mild, chilly rain fell on the SUV as we waited, watching "30 Rock" on a smartphone and snacking on peanuts and beef jerky in lieu of supper.

We had followed Franklin three hours to an empty parking lot off I-74 in High Point, North Carolina, some 200 miles from Wilmington. Something was about to go down, but neither Franklin nor the DEA handler in our SUV would say what.

It's not all shootouts, high-speed chases and kicking down doors, as Hollywood tells it. There's a lot of waiting, watching, listening -- estimating the perfect time to make a move.

At about 9 p.m., the call came. Franklin directed us to an unassuming middle-class neighborhood a quarter-mile away. The exact location: a one-story white house with a "Neighborhood Watch Community" sign in a picture window by the front door.

When we arrived, shadows moved back and forth behind the lattice wall of a carport as police and DEA agents entered and exited the house. Franklin told us that authorities had just found two men inside with 115 pounds of marijuana bricks in a black trash bag.

They also found a ledger suggesting there was more weed at one time. A shoebox containing \$76,899 seemed to confirm it.

Nearby residents seemed clueless about the drugs being moved through their community. After the raid, one concerned and curious neighbor told police there had been break-ins in the area, but that it's generally safe.

At the house where police found the marijuana, the neighbor said, four men had moved in about two weeks prior, but she never saw any moving trucks or furniture, which made her suspicious. She was appalled to learn of the drug arrests and vowed to voice her disapproval to the rental agency that leased the house to the suspects. Although the two men arrested were Latino, nothing during the DEA's surveillance or post-arrest interviews suggested they were linked to any cartel, Franklin said. One of the men carried a driver's license from Washington state, the other from California.

Franklin said he has seen local cases that investigators were able to tie to the Gulf Cartel and Los Zetas -- and there was the 2009 marijuana raid in Ivanhoe -- but drawing a cartel link typically isn't easy.

In recent years, though, law enforcement agencies have been able to put names to some of the cartels they've chased in coordinated strikes.

Operation Xcellerator (Sinaloa Cartel) and projects Coronado and Delirium (La Familia Michoacana) have put thousands of cartel types behind U.S. and Mexican bars. Seizures included tons of marijuana and cocaine, hundreds of pounds of methamphetamine, guns, vehicles and about \$100 million, all linked to specific cartels.

Such operations are anomalous. Cartels like their anonymity, according to police and analysts across the nation. Even if couriers or dealers know which cartel they're working for, they're often too scared to say.

Others are so far down the supply chain that they don't know who they're peddling for. There are also instances where cartel operatives co-opt existing street gangs who already controlled their respective markets -- and seasoned drug dealers know better than to ask a lot of questions about the source of their drugs.

"They're not so kind as to say, 'This dope came from Los Zetas,' " said special agent Jeffrey Scott of the DEA's Seattle bureau, but "if you follow the bread trail far enough back, you're going to hit a cartel phone, courier or money pickup."

Mount Vernon, Monroe, Tacoma and Kelso -- small to midsize cities in Washington state with large Hispanic populations and easy access to interstates -- have seen similar scenarios to those in southeastern North Carolina.

The cities are by no means "infiltrated or controlled" by cartels, Scott said, but there have been major drug cases there since 2009.

Battle of Wilmington

Wilmington certainly fits the bill for a cartel sub-hub. It has the obligatory major thoroughfare, I-40, which runs all the way to Barstow, California, 2,500 miles away. Wilmington's Latinos constitute only around 6 percent of the city's population, but outlying counties like Cumberland, Sampson and Duplin have watched their Latino numbers skyrocket in the past two decades. Employment -- construction in the city and farming in the counties -- is the big draw.

On its face, the 273-year-old, largely white port city wedged between Wrightsville Beach and the Cape Fear River appears an unlikely front in the Mexican drug war.

Bars, restaurants, shops and Spanish moss-draped oaks pepper the quaint downtown, which is bookended by a community college and a century-old Catholic church. Its weather and tidy beaches draw plenty of tourists and retirees.

Thousands of educators, UNC-Wilmington students, government workers, surfers and military personnel call Wilmington home. The regional medical center provides almost 5,000 jobs, while GE, Progress Energy, Corning, Verizon, Walmart and International Paper are also big employers. The pharmaceutical industry also brings thousands of jobs to the city, making Wilmington a player in the legal drug trade as well.

There are seedy parts of town and Wilmington has its share of crime, as does any city of 100,000, but Mexican cartels? The ones that hang journalists from bridges and torch packed casinos?

Wilmington residents shake their heads. Not here. Couldn't be here.

It's a microcosm of what's happening in the country, as cartels quietly begin operating anywhere that lends them a competitive advantage in a market that contains about 4 percent of the world's population yet consumes roughly two-thirds of its illegal drugs.

Phil Jordan, a retired agent and former head of the DEA's El Paso, Texas, Intelligence Center, said the cartels' operations are much like that of chain retail businesses. As the cartels increasingly control the supply and distribution of their product, they concentrate employees where there is demand -- which in the U.S. is pretty much everywhere.

Mexican cartels weren't always so ever-present on this side of the border; it's something that's evolved since the mid-1990s, said Jordan, who joined the DEA in 1965 when it was the Federal Bureau of Narcotics.

"The thing that triggered the mass infiltration into the United States' smaller communities is that methamphetamine has been introduced as a poor man's cocaine," he said.

Since the 1980s, Mexican cartels have smuggled massive amounts of Colombian cocaine into the U.S., but they were often paid in drugs and most of the money had to be sent back to kingpins in Medellin, Cali, Barranquilla or Valle de Cauca.

Meth presented an opportunity to keep all the profits, Jordan explained. Mexican cartels in the 1990s began taking over methamphetamine production from U.S. biker gangs, who had largely controlled the trade through the 1980s. A U.S. crackdown on meth's precursor chemicals -- namely ephedrine, pseudoephedrine and phenylpropanolamine -- culminated in the Combat Methamphetamine Epidemic Act that became law in 2006.

Though the act was designed to disrupt meth production, it solidified the cartels' grip on the market. The cartels needed operatives in place to move the meth. Once those distributors were in place, Jordan said, it became easier to move the cartels' other specialties.

"If you can find Mexican methamphetamine in a community, you'll find the heroin and cocaine," he said.

Yet despite the increasing cartel presence in America, acts of wanton violence like those occurring south of the border aren't so common stateside.

Bowden, whose books reflect reporting from both sides of the border, said the cartels realize it's not smart to exact a Mexican brand of violence in the United States.

"In El Paso, murder's bad for business," he said. "In Juarez, it is business."

The reason is twofold, Jordan said: Cartels fear American law enforcement agencies because they respond to violence more swiftly and forcibly than do their Mexican counterparts, and "since the U.S. is the primary consumer, the cartels will try and avoid disturbing the hand that feeds them."

Still, there are exceptions. Jordan says there have been many kidnappings and a couple of beheadings on U.S. soil that he believes are linked to the cartels.

"America is not a safe haven for those that betray the cartels. They will seek you and kill you," he said, adding that average citizens rarely have to worry. "For the most part, the killing fields of Mexico will not transfer to the U.S., except for those that have betrayed the cartels."

In the U.S., the cartels rely more on bribery than brutality. The Department of Homeland Security in 2009 and 2010 reported record numbers of investigations (576 and 870) into U.S. Border Patrol agent misconduct.

Dozens of agents have been arrested for corruption since 2004, according to an October entry on U.S. security in the periodical *Small Wars Journal*.

Despite the violence south of the border and the corruption north of it, the periodical noted that violent and property crimes in Southwest border towns generally decreased between 2005 and 2009.

"No mass murders, piles of corpses in the middle of highways, decapitations, mutilations, incinerations or tortured bodies hanging in urban bridges have been registered in the U.S. side of the border," the periodical states.

Mazatlan offers lesson

Agent Franklin is familiar with scenes on both sides of the border. From 2001 to 2004, before he took the helm at Wilmington in 2007, he was stationed in the Pacific Coast city of Mazatlan, in Mexico's cartel-ridden Sinaloa state.

Back then, the cartels were operating in the U.S., but their dealings were largely concentrated along the border and in major cities. As drug trafficking increased with the spike in immigration, Franklin said, cartels found more and more ways to exploit their most profitable market.

Franklin's duties in Mazatlan often involved working with Mexican authorities on interdiction efforts. Many of them, including 2001's Operation Trifecta, which spanned 19 months from 2001 to 2003, involved maritime smuggling.

Trifecta began after a source tipped off authorities to more than 10 tons of cocaine on a fishing vessel, the Macel, off the Pacific Coast of Mexico. The operation yielded 240 arrests in the U.S. and in Mexico, along with tons more drugs, mostly marijuana and cocaine.

The operation's success helped Franklin realize the importance of sources. An incident the year after the Macel seizure solidified the notion.

In February 2002, a shootout after a traffic stop in Mazatlan left three men, one of them a police officer, dead in the streets. Police and local newspapers identified one of the dead as Jorge Perez Lopez, the name on the man's fake ID.

A few days after the shooting, Franklin said, a source came forward and told authorities that the man was actually Ramon Arellano Felix, a brutal enforcer of the Arellano Felix cartel.

"Ohh, the value of the source!" Franklin wrote in an e-mail containing newspaper reports of the shootout.

Those lessons in Mazatlan are one of the reasons Franklin and his bureau hold sources so dearly today. It also was an impetus in the creation of the Spanish tip line.

Simple as it may seem, the tip line has provided some of the biggest cases for the Wilmington bureau in recent years, many of them with suspected links to cartels.

Franklin did not want to divulge exact numbers, nor could he speak about more recent, ongoing cases, but he said the tip line is responsible for the seizures of tons of marijuana, hundreds of kilograms of various illicit powders, dozens of weapons and millions in currency. Among the seizures in North Carolina:

- A commercial-grade refrigerator concealing 23 kilograms of cocaine was intercepted at a trailer park in Warsaw in September 2009. It had been shipped from Brownsville, Texas. Inside the Warsaw mobile home, police found cutting agents, packing materials, a cocaine press and a loaded handgun with its hammer cocked. Two Mexican nationals were arrested.
- A March 2010 drug and weapon seizure in Duplin and Sampson counties turned up an AK-47 as well as a .50-caliber sniper rifle that had been reported stolen from a Marine at nearby Camp Lejeune. Two Mexican nationals were arrested.
- Five pounds of methamphetamine were seized in Columbus County in July. One Mexican national was arrested.

- A pair of 2011 raids in Robeson County resulted in the seizure of 118 kilos of cocaine and more than \$550,000. In the second of those busts in August, officers dug up 90 kilograms of cocaine buried under a shed on a farm.
- In September, nearly \$660,000 was seized in a seedy Robeson County hotel room.

Some seizures, like a 2-kilogram meth bust in Brunswick County in January, may seem small, but they count as huge successes for local law enforcement partners.

Tip line calls don't always prove so fruitful. Shortly after the High Point raid, agents received information that led them to a location near Raeford. We followed Franklin for two hours before waiting at a nearby gas station for instructions.

It was about 1 a.m. when Franklin called to say the surveillance had gone cold. After a long day -- 19 hours for some agents -- everyone headed home.

The next day, that investigation hadn't moved anywhere, but agents had a bead on a La Familia Michoacana member long wanted for cocaine and gun crimes. Franklin instructed me to drive to Supply, North Carolina, and wait. Agents later decided to make their move the next day.

In the morning, Franklin met me and the DEA handler at a Hardee's in Supply to say it was a case of mistaken identity. Agents had been watching the wrong guy the night before.

Such mistakes aren't unusual, Franklin said. Though the tip line has allowed the bureau to cultivate well-placed sources, it also has sent agents on wild goose chases. The quality of the information varies.

"We invest most in what's going to get the biggest bang," Franklin said. "You've got to kiss a lot of frogs to find a prince."

Asked if the good information is worth the false calls, Franklin laughed and said, "Two longball-hitting informants can keep you busy for days -- days and nights."

At the \$1,000 a month the DEA pays four radio stations to air the ad a few times every other week, the tip line has already paid for itself for the rest of Franklin's life. The 115 pounds of marijuana in High Point alone could pick up that tab.

Wake schools accused of discriminating against Latino students

Two advocacy groups filed a federal civil rights complaint Tuesday accusing the Wake County school system of discriminating against Latino families with limited English skills by not sending them important documents in Spanish.

The complaint filed by the Southern Poverty Law Center and Advocates for Children's Services charges that Wake is violating the civil rights of Hispanic families by not providing them adequate translation services.

The complaint asks the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights to require North Carolina's largest school system to make changes, such as providing documents about suspensions and special education services in Spanish to parents with limited proficiency in English.

“Wake County public schools must end this discrimination and recognize that these students and their parents have the same rights as English-speaking students,” Caren Short, a staff attorney for the Alabama-based Southern Poverty Law Center, said in a written statement. “This is about ensuring every student in the district has the right to succeed.”

The Wake County school system issued a statement Tuesday saying it was “disappointed” that the complaint was filed.

“The Wake County Public School System is committed to providing support for all parents with limited English proficiency, regardless of their primary language,” according to the district’s statement. “WCPSS staff, from the central office to the school level, are actively reviewing our practices to ensure we are meeting families’ needs at every opportunity.”

The complaint is one of several filed in recent years by groups who have alleged that school districts across the country are violating Title VI of the federal Civil Rights Act by not providing adequate translation services. Title VI prohibits institutions that receive federal funding from discriminating based on race and national origin.

In November, the Durham school system settled with federal investigators after a complaint was filed by the Southern Poverty Law Center. Durham school officials agreed to a number of steps, including strengthening the school district’s anti-discrimination policy, translating report cards, and improving communication with parents who are not native English speakers.

In the Wake case, the two groups had sent a notice to the district on May 8 warning that they might take action unless changes were made. This led to meetings between the organizations and the school system over the complaints of three Hispanic families who say they didn’t get needed documents in Spanish.

The school system said Tuesday that its administrators and attorney are investigating the three cases to determine whether the district can make changes to better serve the families. According to the district’s statement, the groups were “impressed” with Wake’s efforts to serve the families.

Peggy Nicholson, a staff attorney for Advocates for Children’s Services, a project of Legal Aid of N.C., said Tuesday that the school system offered to provide translation of documents when requested by families. But she said the groups making the complaint considered that to be too much of a burden to place on the families.

“We feel they should be providing automatic translation services to families who are limited-English proficient,” Nicholson said.

Nicholson, whose group represents three Hispanic students who faced suspensions of more than 11 days from school, says her clients didn’t receive specific information in Spanish even though Wake knew the parents had limited English skills. She said the groups bringing the complaints have heard of other Hispanic families having similar problems with Wake.

District is 15% Latino

Citing past federal guidance, the groups contend that Wake should be providing written translation services because Latino students account for 15 percent of the district’s 146,000 students. The fast-growing Hispanic population has helped make Wake the 16th-largest school system in the country.

“We’re hoping that a complaint in Wake County will benefit a large number of students,” Jerri Katzerman, deputy legal director for the Southern Poverty Law Center, said Tuesday. “I hope it gives direction to other school systems that may not be as large.”

Cockfight busted in Statesville, 9 arrested

Nine men were arrested Sunday on cockfighting and animal cruelty charges after an anonymous tipster alerted the Iredell County Animal Services & Control office to an alleged cockfight in progress off Cove Gap Road.

After receiving the anonymous call, Animal Control and Iredell County Sheriff's Office deputies arrived at a mobile home at 285 Cove Gap Road, where about 25 people were gathered behind the house staging cockfights in the open grass, reports indicate.

The home is owned by owned by Robert Lee Holland, reports indicate.

Chris Royal, director of the Iredell County Animal Services & Control, said everyone scattered when they saw the law enforcement officers. Nine were caught. Warrants for another seven were issued Monday.

“They even left two roosters fighting,” said Royal. “They just took off running.”

A total of 29 live roosters were seized. Another 13 were found dead, discarded in a large pile off to the side of where the fighting was taking place. There were also 97 knives confiscated, which Royal said the men were taping to the roosters' legs during fights.

“It’s rough to see them bleeding,” Royal said. “You know they’re hurting. I mean, they’re animals.”

Royal said people have been arrested for cockfighting in the county before, but that they had never been caught in the act.

“People say, ‘That’s what they’ve always done,’ ” Royal said. “Well, we’re not going to put up with it in Iredell County.”

Three dogs, which Royal said were “very thin,” were also taken from the home. Reports indicate the home is owned by Robert Lee Holland.

All those arrested were charged with cockfighting, a felony, and cruelty to animals, a misdemeanor.

Man who drunkenly hijacked Greyhound in N.C. gets 19 years

A federal court sentenced **Jose Darwin Flores** Wednesday to **19-plus years in prison for drunkenly hijacking a Greyhound bus** with a pellet gun in April 2011.

Flores, 33, was arrested near Henderson when he agreed to allow the driver to exit to a gas station. The Arlington, Va., resident had taken over the bus by force with a pellet gun resembling a real pistol as the bus entered North Carolina on I-85 during its southbound, Washington, D.C., to Miami run.

After initially demanding to get off the bus, which he was denied by the driver due to safety concerns, an intoxicated Flores pulled out the gun, pressed it to the driver's head and then demanded the lights turned on so passengers could see the gun. Flores struck the driver at least twice and threatened to "make an example" of a passenger.

The driver exited the interstate at Flores' command, and all but four passengers escaped by jumping through windows and emergency exit. Flores ordered the bus to continue south, this time with law enforcement in pursuit. He ordered the driver to pull over on the side of I-85 to let two elderly passengers out, but then the bus continued until exiting to the Henderson gas station.

Flores tried to drive the bus away after confronted by law enforcement, but could not disengage the emergency break. He exited the bus with the gun at his side; when he refused to drop it an officer snuck up from around the front of the bus and subdued him with a Taser.

He was sentenced to 235 months in prison. He had pled guilty in January to charges of violence against a mass transportation provider.
